- **Prize for Best Medical Engineering Project (£500)**

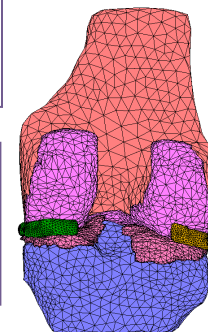
Open to recent graduates (2006), third/fourth year undergraduates and taught masters degree students, who have completed or are working on a medical device project.
